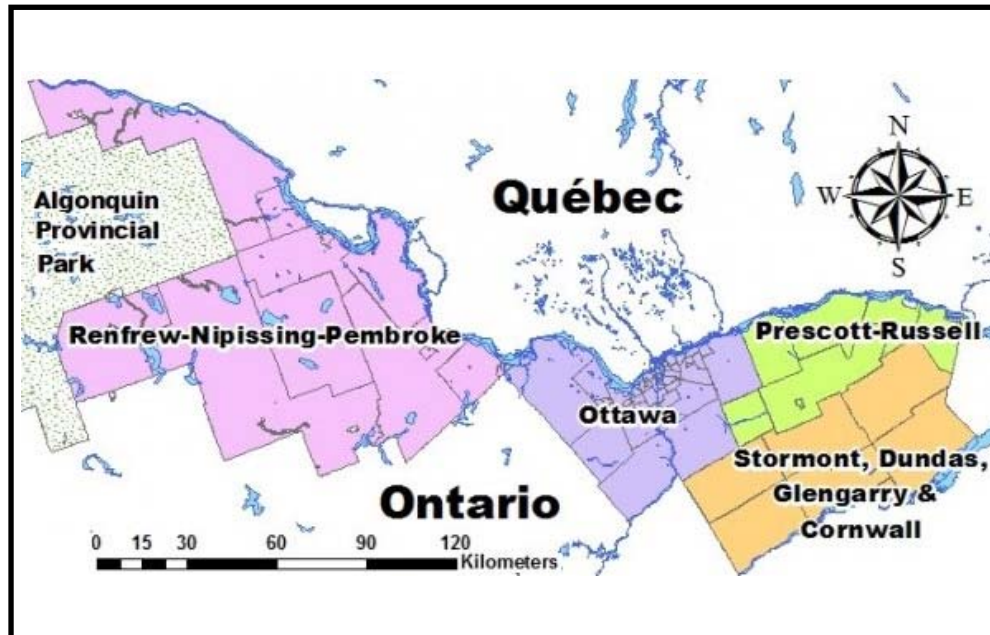
PARTNERSHIP HIGHLIGHT

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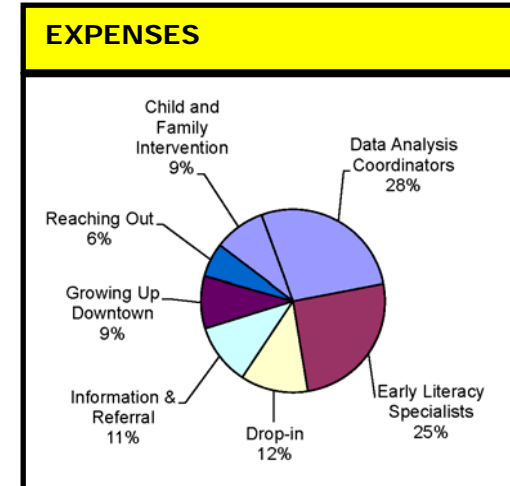

A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT

This year, we recognize our 39th year of operation and reflect on why the Parent Resource Centre (PRC) matters. Since 1976, the Parent Resource Centre has operated on two basic principles: we bring people together and we support children, families, caregivers and front line workers through their journey of growth in whatever form it may take. We have years of demonstrated success in facilitating discussions, teaching skills, advocating for parents and families, helping infants and children and educating the community. During the year, PRC met several of its goals through extensive planning and cross team collaboration. We completed an organizational review, developed an operational plan, communication plan and a logic model. All of this work created a stronger framework and a more efficient organizational structure for PRC.

When we plan, coordinate and act together to achieve a common goal the synergy created from working collaboratively results in greater accomplishments.

We want to acknowledge our primary funders; the Ministry of Children and Youth, Ministry of Education and the City of Ottawa not only for their financial contribution but for providing guidance and insight as we fine tune our programs to better serve children and families.

An integral part of an organization's success is its staff. At PRC, each staff member brings value to this organization with a passion for what they do. During our transition to a new organizational structure, our two Managers, Micki Di Cesare and Lisa Molnar, shared the role of Acting Executive Director. I would like to express my appreciation for their commitment to our purpose and to the communities we serve. Another critical component of PRC is the work performed by the board members. Their dedication to children and families and selfless gift of their time make a difference in very real ways. We truly enjoy working with so many incredible people.
